SENER Foundation offers combined study and work grants that enable students to attend post graduate courses (MSc or similar) in prestigious universities in Spain and other European countries and to gain working experience in one of SENER offices.

This year's grant program is addressed to students in their last year of education and to young professionals with technical university background, being nationals of Belarus, Kazakhstan, the Russian Federation or Ukraine. Successful candidates will attend a one year post graduate course in a selected university field followed by a similar length working period under a temporary contract with SENER Ingeniería y Sistemas.

 - 2 return flight tickets per year to your country of residence

Candidate requirements:

- Eligible candidates must be either university students in their last year of education (we require that you graduate by 30 September 2010) or young professionals who have graduated from the university program within the last two years
- Your university background must be in one or more of the following fields: gas & energy, space instrumentations, transport, civil engineering, or similar.
- A proven record of good and excellent university grades throughout the entire period of the university program
- Good knowledge of English
- The willingness and ability to learn Spanish in a short period of time (Spanish speaking candidates will receive additional points in the selection process)
